

Integrated Video & Security Technology Seminar @ The Lowry Arts Centre (Hexagon Room) Salford Quays, Manchester

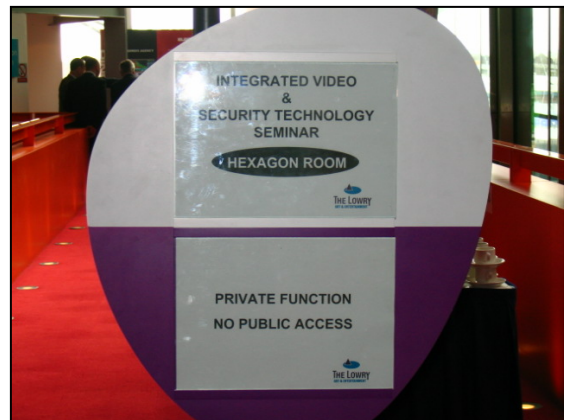
